

Our Guest Musicians this Month are:

Angela Koregelos studied flute in Paris with Alain Marion and Jean-Pierre Rampal, both professors at the Paris Conservatory, and James Pappoutsakis at the New England Conservatory. At the age of twenty, she was appointed principal flutist of the Oakland Symphony where she performed under the direction of numerous inspiring conductors such as Calvin Simmons, Kent Nagano, and Maxim Shostakovich. She later joined the San Francisco Opera Orchestra where she fell in love with vocal music and performed in the live recording of Massanet's *Herodiade* with Renée Fleming, Placido Domingo, and Dolora Zajick in the title roles and Valery Gergiev on the podium.

Angela made her recital debut to critical acclaim at London's Wigmore Hall, is a co-founder of the Pacific Arts Ensemble, and was a frequent guest with The Sierra Chamber Society and Composers Inc. She served as Instructor of Flute and Chamber music at Mills College from 1978 to 2005 and visiting instructor at the Stratford International Flute Festival (UK) and the International Flute Festival at the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM). She makes her home in Ashland, OR with her husband, jazz trumpeter Peter Anastos and co-coordinates Classical Vespers with Robin Blomquist.

Katheryn McElrath, flutist, maintains an active musical career, filling the roles of orchestral player, concerto soloist, studio musician, chamber artist and teacher. She is a graduate of The Juilliard School, earning both a Bachelors and Masters degree. She studied with such noted teachers as Julius Baker, Samuel Baron, Paula Robison, Jean-Pierre Rampal and Alain Marion.

In addition to her work as principal flutist with the Rogue Valley Symphony, Katheryn has served as principal flutist of the Oakland East Bay Symphony and the North State Symphony. She has also appeared with the San Francisco Opera, Pocket Opera, the Oakland Ballet, Oakland Opera, the Marin Symphony, the Skywalker Symphony, the San Francisco Bach Orchestra, the San Francisco Chamber Orchestra, Composer's, Inc., San Francisco Contemporary Music Players, Contare con Vivo, Southern Oregon Repertory Singers, the Britt Festival Orchestra, Lake Tahoe Festival Orchestra, the San Francisco "Lamplighters" Music Theatre, the Rogue Valley Chorale and Rogue Music Theatre.

She can be heard on Linda Ronstadt's CD's, "Frenesi" and "Mas Canciones". Katheryn has also recorded with Randy Newman, Ray Charles and with Sir John Williams and the Skywalker Symphony. As a member of The Flute Exchange, she has performed across the country, and is featured on the CD's, "From Pit to Stage", and American composer, John Thow's, "Songs of the Earth." **Kris Yenney, M.M.**, cellist, conductor, composer, and educator ~ and long time Bay Area Music Maven... received her Master of Music degree from the New England Conservatory of Music with continuing post- graduate studies

conducted at such institutions as the Juilliard School (NY), the Tanglewood Institute, the Banff Centre for the Arts and the Chisti Sabri School of Classical Indian Music in Jaipur, India).

She served for many years as director and senior chamber music workshop faculty for the Palo Alto Chamber Orchestras and as Director of Orchestras and founder of the Chamber Music Societies at the Woodside Priory School in Portola Valley, at Nueva Learning Center and at Sacred Heart Prep - Atherton.

A sought-after free-lance player, Kris was a founding member of the cutting-edge Left Coast Chamber Ensemble of San Francisco, cellist of the New England String Quartet (NESQ) of Boston among other ensembles. She is part of the the Celtic and Early Music Trio, "Broceliande," currently celebrating more than two decades of togetherness. She teaches cello and chamber music privately and can be heard on numerous recordings ranging from Classical to Celtic to Jazz.
