Next weekend you'll find Josie Metz leading a crew tidying up the church nursery as we prepare for fall programs. And a couple of weeks after that she begins leading a 10-week class in *Women of the Bible*. And besides all of that, she works with folks in Parish Five for the Board of Deacons.

It's all part of a busy life of service and sharing.

Josie began life in Minnesota in a town near St. Paul. She was one of nine children in a Catholic family, five boys and four girls. Her first job, at age 15, was living with and caring for a family during the week, returning home on weekends. She also worked at a nursing home.
