Updated immunization records

Parents, please get me a copy of updated immunization records when your child goes to the pediatrician and gets any vaccines. This helps me to keep our records up to date. I have a large immunization report due to the Jackson County Health Department in early January. Oregon State-wide Immunization Exclusion Day is February 19, 2025. Any child not up to date by this day will be excluded from school until proof of required vaccines is provided. Please see me if you have any questions. I am here to help!

Center Building Update

We are happy to report that the dry-out phase of our water damage project at the Center is now complete. After a further detailed investigation and consultation with Belfor and a local plumbing outfit, we now believe a large portion of the cause of our water damage came from a clogged downspout & plugged drain that then forced water to seep into the building. We have disputed the original denial of our insurance claim using this new information, and we hope and pray our insurance company will accept our claim and cover at least part of the damage. Belfor began work on restoration of our flooring surfaces at the Center at the end of September.
