

## From the pastor's study

Modern Christmas is a balancing act between two different poles.

On the one hand, Christmas is one of the two high holy days (or feast days if you heard my sermon last week!) of the year. (The other is Easter.) It is a Christian holiday celebrating the incarnation—the coming of God as the baby in Bethlehem. It celebrates one of the great mysteries of Christianity—that God became a human being in the person of Jesus. Saint Athanasius, a theologian from North Africa said, "The

Son of God became man so that man might become God."

For the theologian Karl Barth, when Jesus took on human flesh, he took on all humanity, which is the basis for our relationship with God in Jesus Christ.

But there is the other Christmas, the Christmas of reindeer, trees and candles, lights and bells, jingling bells, and of course that famous figure without whom Christmas could not exist, Santa.

In other words, there is a Christian and a secular Christmas. The balancing act is giving each its due. Without Christ, Christmas is just Xmas. The whole reason for the holiday is to celebrate the work of God in Mary.

But we must remember Christ came into the world. We are to enjoy the world. There are people who rail

at Secular Christmas, because they think a secular celebration of a religious holiday demeans God. Well, God is not as fragile as some people think. We cannot demean God. God is God, whether we worship God or not.

I personally love both Christmases. I love the Advent and Christmas worship services, the hymns and carols of Christmas, and especially the celebration of God becoming one of us.

And I love secular Christmas. As I said in the sermon last week, we can enjoy the Christmas season. We can put up trees (a pagan custom) and light candles, read Dickens's *A Christmas Carol*, enjoy Christmas movies, and celebrate the day itself with a feast, friends and family.

# Retirement, transition eyed

Session this week laid the groundwork for the January 12, 2025 retirement of Pastor Murray Richmond and the process which leads to seeking a new senior pastor. They approved a short term covenant with Pastor Mike Hubbard that ends when Pastor Murray steps down, and agreed to then go forward with hiring Pastor Mike as a full-time "bridge pastor" for up to a year. Presbytery of the Cascades will help with details. Clark Scarlea, presbytery advocate for congregations and clergy, and Steve Roe, liaison to our regional Commission on Ministry, joined in the discussion. They will assist as we seek a consultant and begin the search for a replacement pastor.

In other action, Session set combined worship services for 10 a.m. on Sunday, December 29, 2024 and for 10 a.m. Sunday, January 12, 2025. That will be Pastor Murray's last day in the pulpit. A congregational meeting is called immediately after the service to end Pastor Murray's call with us. A celebration of his ministry will be held after the congregational meeting.

Session set December 17 for their final meeting of the year, and scheduled adoption of the 2025 budget. It was reviewed in preliminary form this week, incorporating expected expenses of the pastoral transition.
