Session adopts budget, prepares for transition

In December Session adopted a \$941,527 2025 budget in preparation for a time of transition as Pastor Murray Richmond retires and Pastor Mike Hubbard steps up as Bridge Pastor while we seek our next senior pastor. The adopted budget anticipates using up to \$85,840 from undesignated reserves in addition to offerings, rents and fees offsetting expenses.

Pastor Murray's last worship service with us will be at 10 a.m. January 12, followed by a formal congregational meeting to release him to retirement. The Fellowship committee will host a reception honoring Murray after the congregational meeting.

Session set the annual meeting of the congregation for Sunday, January 29 following a combined 10 a.m. worship service. Business includes receiving reports on 2024 activities and finances, election of new elders and deacons, and honoring those officers completing service to the congregation.

Nominees for the three positions in Session Class of 2028 are incumbents Patty Herkert and Dan Johnson. The nominating committee is still seeking candidates for the remaining position, and a vacancy in the Class of 2027 caused by resignation of Elder Nikki Keating, who wishes to transfer to the Board of Deacons. Nominees for the four positions in Deacons Class of 2028 are Nikki Keating, Loni Hagler, Marilyn Hultquist and Ellen Rancik. The nominating committee is still seeking candidates for a vacancy in the Class of 2027.

At the annual meeting, we will also elect seven members to the 2025 Congregational Nominating Committee. Nominations from the floor, offered with consent of the nominees, will be accepted for all the leadership positions up for election.


